WINGS Tests are written tests that assess every choir member's knowledge of necessary information. Nothing on a WINGS Test is fluff – every bit of information on a Wings Test is Wildly Important – if students don't know this information we can't get better.

The first few WINGS Tests of each year will be pretty easy – many of you won't even have to learn anything new. As we go throughout the year you'll be challenged with terms and ideas you might have known but need to review and new information even for the most experienced musician.

WINGS Tests will be Fill-In-The-Blank. No word bank, no matching. Just your brain, pencil, and paper. WINGS Tests will also be eerily similar to each Test's Review Sheet. No surprises!

TREBLE CLEF



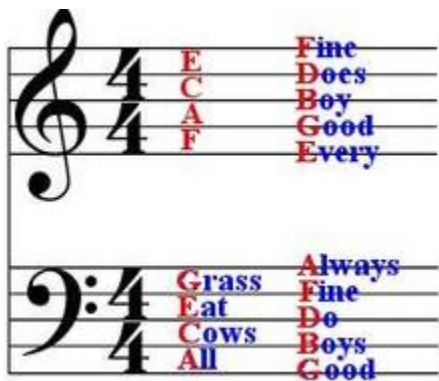
Used by Sopranos, Altos, sometimes Tenors, and the Right Hand of the Piano.

BASS CLEF



Used by Basses, sometimes Tenors, and the Right Hand of the Piano.
